## HALLOWEEN SAFTEY TIPS COVID 19


This year Halloween will look a little different.

### How Parents Can Help Keep St. Helen's School Safe

School staff is working very hard to follow Public Health Rules and Guidelines. The students are doing an excellent job adjusting to the many protocols we have put in place. We need the support of the parents to ensure our school remains safe.

- 1. Pack your child's lunch in the morning and avoid dropping off lunches or picking up your child for lunch.
  - 2. If you are waiting outside your car for your child, please wear a mask.
    - 3. Leave immediately after drop-off and pick-up.
- 4. Respect designated drop-off and pick-up areas. Don't make alternate arrangements with your child.
- 5. If your child has forgotten something, please do not bring it to the school, we will accommodate their needs (ie. mask, gym clothes).
  - 6. Students are only allowed to use the school phone for emergencies.
  - 7. Please notify teachers the day before or before 8:30am the day of if you plan to pick up your child before dismissal so they can make arrangements.
